## Five feared killed in Army, pipeline vandals clash

HERE was apprehension in Ibafo and Arepo axis on Lagos-Ibadan Expressway yesterday following heavy shootings between operatives of the Nigerian Navy and Army elements and petroleum pipeline vandals.

Five vandals were allegedly feared dead during the clash.

Eyewitness told The Guardian that the incident commuters, caused motorists and residents to

run for dear lives. "The clash was between military people and the blackmarket sellers. So, many people were killed during the clash. The oil thieves attempted to send military personnel out of the area by attacking them with guns but the military resisted and fought back", the eyewitness

Meanwhile, the Ogun State Police Command boss, Abdulmajid Ali, told The Guardian on telephone that he was aware of the shooting, saying the military operatives did not carry the police along.

"There was heavy shooting. It is a clash between the Army and petroleum van-

dals," he said.

Besides, the Assistant Director of Army Public Relations in charge of 81 Division, Lt.-Col. Kingsley Samuel told *The Guardian* that he was not aware of the shooting.

But when The Guardian contacted Naval spokesman in Lagos, Lieutenant Commander Abdulkadir, he noted that the operation was carried out by Nigerian defence elements from the Defence Headquarters and not the Western Naval Command.
