Three die in Delta auto crash

A MULTIPLE ghastly auto crash on the busy Benin-Asaba Expressway, by the budding Asaba Airport, has resulted in the death of three persons.

According to an eyewitness, who works at the airport, the accident, which occurred yesterday, was apparently due to over-speeding as the two ill-fated vehicles, which were traveling in opposite directions collided head on.

The source explained that about seven vehicles were involved in the accident as the drivers of other vehicles tailing the two vehicles that collided, lost control and rammed into them.

He said a combined team of policemen and officials of the Federal Road Safety Corps (FRSC) supervised the evacuation of the victims to the hospital for treatment while the corpses had been deposited at an undisclosed hospital mortuary.

The accident caused a heavy vehicular traffic on the road, which connects the major towns of Benin, Edo State to Agbor and Asaba both in Delta State, to the market town of Onitsha in Anambra State just across the River Niger.

Speaking on the phone, the Delta State FRSC spokesperson, Mary Eze, said she was out of town and was not abreast of the details.
