Missing woman found buried in shallow grave

A WOMAN in her 50's, Mrs. Regina Bulus, who was declared missing since October 21, 2016, was later discovered to have been killed and hurriedly buried in a shallow grave in Jenta Mangoro area of Jos North Local Council, Plateau State on October 23.

The Plateau State Police Command's Spokesman, Assistant Superintendent Typep Terna, confirmed the incident to *The Guardian* yesterday.

According to police record, on October 26, 2016 at about 14:20 hours, one Bitrus Moses in Jenta Mangoro went to Police 'A' Division in Jos, and reported that on October 23 at about 11:00pm, he received a phone call from one Laraba David (female) of the same address in Jenta Mangoro that his mother, Regina Bulus, was missing since October 21.

He added that her uncle, one Yakubu Moses of Gada Biu community in Jos North

was searching for her whereabouts. "But information later got to Bitrus that the same Yakubu Moses whom they said was helping in searching for the missing woman, and one Jumai Luka allegedly conspired together with one Buhari Yakubu and Benjamin Garba, both males of the same address, to kill his mother.

"They alleged that the deceased bewitched Mrs. Jumai Lukas' daughter, which led to her becoming terribly sick before she later died on October 23, at Our Lady of Apostle's (OLA) hospital in Jos."

The police spokesman remarked that after a discreet investigation into the matter, one of the prime suspects was arrested and the matter has since been transferred from 'A' Division Police Station to the State Criminal Investigation Department (CID) for further investigation and subsequent arrest of the three remaining suspects.

stands now, out of the four suspects, it is only one of them that has been arrested. But the case is still under investigation. The site of the grave has been identified and it has been photographed.

"But the Division lacks the capacity to go on with the exhumation and some other issues, that is why they had to transfer the case to the state CID, which has the manpower and wherewithal to carry out the rest of the investigation until the matter is brought to a logical conclusion," he said.
