Shock as body of young lady is dumped in Isheri community

THE shock, bewilderment and angst were unmistakable yesterday when residents of Ajibade Odetayo Street at Isheri Osun in Iko-tun-Igando Local Council Development Area (LCDA) of Lagos State woke up to meet the body of a young girl in her early 20s dumped in their locality.

The crowd that came around to behold the sight of the youngster was seen speaking in hush tones, wondering what could have befallen the sleepy community.

The Guardian, during a visit to the scene, learnt that the lad, who was without bruises, might have been killed elsewhere and eventually dumped on the street.

In a chat with our reporter,

a senior female officer from the Isheri Police Station, who craved anonymity, said her team was in the area after being briefed by the landlords association about the incident.

She noted that the Lagos Neighbourhood Watch had visited and taken shots of the deceased with a promise to return for evacuation.

The female cop inadvertently exposed the helplessness of the force when she submitted that "we do not have ambulance, that is why we have not taken her away. But the Neighbourhood Watch has said it is their duty to evacuate her and they have promised to come back for her."

Efforts to reach the chairman of the landlord association were futile as at press time.
