One feared killed in fresh Ogbe-Ijoh, Aladja clash

THE protracted communal clashes between Ogbe-Ijoh in Warri-South West Local Council and Aladaja in Udu Local Council over land reared its ugly head again yesterday as youths from both communities exchanged gunfire. The gun duel led to the death of one person while over six persons sustained injuries of varying degrees.

The Guardian gathered that the crisis started at about 10:00a.m. when Oghe-Ijoh youths engaged the neighbouring Aladja in a gun battle. Despite the deployment of soldiers and policemen to strategic locations in the area, the youths reportedly opened a new front in another axis of the border and exchanged gunfire for several hours.

A source in Aladja confirmed that stray bullets hit six persons, while one died on the way to the hospital. The heavy shooting disrupted activities in both towns, as the Aladja Market and schools in the neighbourhood were forced to shut down while parents ferried their wards from school.

Former President of Aladja Community Council, Tabuko Kabedje, told reporters that Ogbe-Ijoh people started the fight and Aladja Community was shocked at the attack.

Efforts to speak with the monarch of Ogbe-Ijoh, Pere Charles Oromoni were unfruitful, as all calls to his cell phone number were neither taken nor returned.
