Two persons were killed in a robbery attack on an old generation bank in llawe Ekiti, headquarters of Ekiti. Southwest Local Govern-ment Area of Eloti State, yes-

In the operation that lasted for over an hour, it was learn? that armed robbers killed a ing policeman and a bank worker. Another bank worker was also reportedly shot by the bandits in the arm. The yet to be identified police-man, according to sources. was an orderly attached to one of the council bosses in the state

A source told journalists that the armed bandits invaded the bank beside Alawe's palace and broke the security door with the aid of a dynamite before entering the banking hall at about 2:45p.m. The eyewitness disclosed that the dynamite also blew up a blue coloured Toyota Camry parked in the vicinity of the bank The robbers reportedly stole an unspecified amount of

Confirming the incident, the Alawe of Ilawe-Ekiti, Oba Adebanji Alabi, expressed shock at the incident, lamenting that the robbers turned his domain to a warfront by firing dynamite and grenade, which caused panic and paralysed business and social activities.

He said: "It was a terrible experience, my palace is very close to the bank. It was terrifying, it was like a war front. kept detonating grenades during the attack. I was in the palace during the robbery, the attack happened

successful as at the time of fil-In Enugu State, activities stood still as tempers rose for many hours on Monday night along the Enugu-Port Harcourt expressway as lorry drivers resorted to protest over the killing of a passenger by a trigger-happy police offi-

For many hours, movement in and out of Enugu was disrupted as various lorries and tankers were used to block the Aninri axis of the dual carriageway by the drivers. A member of a police patrol team was said to have fired at a moving lorry with registration number DNG 612 XA, dalling one of the passengers.

A source linked the cause of the incident that occurred at about 9:30p.m. to a disagreement over "roger", while an-

other said it was due to the refusal of the lorry driver to stop when he was flagged

Alarmed by the development, all lorries operating along the route decided to stop further operations as they used their vehicles to block the highway, making it difficult for other road users. Aworried Commissioner of Police, Dan Mallam Mo-hammed, has vowed that the culprit would not go unpunished. The commissioner who sympathised with members of the public over the hardship they were meant to go through over the incident, said that being a police officer and armed with a gun does not give one license to kill.

Meanwhile, the Lagos State police command yesterday arrested three persons for their alleged involvement in the death of one Nurudeen pandemonium, gunshots at the venue of the recently held local government primary election organised by one Nurudeen Lanlese, 40, the All Progressive Congress was found in a pool of blood
