

This was confirmed by the Deputy Commissioner of Police in charge of the State CID, Patrick Edung, when he led a police team to evacuate the bodies of the trio for deposition in a mortuary.

According to him, the police became aware of the deaths when it was reported to it.

It was speculated by church members and relatives during the evacuation of the deceased to the mortuary that they were likely murdered last Sunday because the two pastors abstained from the penultimate Sunday's service.

"It was on Friday evening when we visited Pastor Kelechi's house that their dead bodies were seen," the source said.
