# Three die in Ogun, Anambra road crashes

**T**HE Ogun State Traffic Compliance and Enforcement Corps (TRACE) has said a motorcyclist was crushed to death by a truck marked XA 539 BBJ, yesterday opposite Deeper Life Camp on the Lagos-Ibadan Expressway. There was confusion as angry youths protested the death of the rider. TRACE spokesman, Babatunde Akinbiyi, said the road crash occurred at about 11:00a.m. It was gathered that a hit-and-run car had knocked down the motorcycle, marked WDE 415 VD, to the side of the moving truck, which Akinbiyi said, unknowingly crushed the rider to death. "According to an eyewitness, the hit-and-run car from behind hit the motorcyclist into the front of a moving truck, which ran over him and he died immediately," he said. The incident, he added, "created a pandemonium for some minutes along the expressway with area boys beating and hitting everyone in sight because the deceased rider was a resident in the area. The driver of the truck has been arrested by policemen

from Mowe Divisional Police Command and the body of the deceased has been deposited at the morgue of Idera Hospital, Sagamu. TRACE Mowe-Ibafo Divisional Commander, Ojuoro Olusola, advised motorists and motorcyclists to always exercise patience on the road to avoid unnecessary loss of life.
