

He also said the second accident, which was as a result of tyre burst, happened at Lakanla bridge. Eight persons were involved and one person died.

The FRSC commander also revealed that the bodies had been deposited at the University of Ilorin Teaching Hospital morgue and those who sustained injuries were receiving treatment. He, however, cautioned motorists against night journeys and reckless driving to protect their lives and those of the passengers.

“Trucks should compulsorily use reflectors when parked by roadsides or highways, overloading should be avoided, they overburden the tyres and cause them to burst. Drivers should avoid night journeys, they have to be more careful, life has no duplicate. There is nothing bad in stopping the journey when night falls,” he added.

Meanwhile, one person has been confirmed dead in an accident that occurred around Isara bridge, on the Lagos-Ibadan Expressway. A bus was said to have rammed into two men who were by the roadside fixing the axle problem of their trailer.
