We Counted 15 Dead Protesters At Lekki Toll Gate'

NE of the main actors in Jthe EndSARS protest, isc Jockey, songwriter and iusician, Obianuju atherine Udeh, a.k.a DJ witch, has said that she ounted 15 dead Nigerians fter soldiers opened fire on narmed protesters at the ekki Toll Gate on Tuesday. In a video she posted on her nstagram handle yesterday, he artist said while she was ive streaming, seven people had died, and before her phone battery ran out, they counted 15 people that were shot dead at the scene.

lap, said she can't confirm if the casualties were more than 15, but insisted many more people sustained gunshots wounds.

"People died, it wasn't photoshopped. I must be a tech genius to photoshop a live feed. While the soldiers were running around picking the bullet shells, the protesters also picked up some of the bullet casings because we wanted to have proof of the atrocity," she said.

Giving an eyewitness account, DJswitch, who herself sustained injuries, said the federal government should not insult the sensibility of grieving families and other Nigerians by deny-

ing the massacre.

DJ Switch, however, said the protesters made a mistake by dumping the dead bodies at the foot of the soldiers who took them away in their vans never to be seen again. Revealing her life is under threat, she said the struggle must continue, adding that if it stops now, the youths may never get the chance to talk again.

"But we must continue peacefully. I condemn any form of violence and the burning of buses, houses and people's livelihoods," she said.

Meanwhile, Ekiti State Governor, Kayode Fayemi, has appealed for peace in Ekiti and southwest over continued violence resulting from #EndSARS protest in the region.

Fayemi, who stated this in a statewide broadcast in Ado Ekiti yesterday, said that things took a dangerous turn over the weekend as miscreants took advantage of the protest to launch unimaginable level of violence on the public in Ekiti and in other states, adding that the import of the protest has been largely achieved.

He said that as a result of those who unleashed mayhem on private and public property, the state government was compelled to impose a 24-hour curfew in the state.
