LAUTECH teaching hospital clears air over death of student

THE LAUTECH Teaching Hospital, Ogbomoso, Oyo State, has cleared the air over the death of a 500-level student of the university, Mr. Afeson Nifemi Bernard.

While the hospital sympathised with the parents, friends, colleagues and the entire Ladoke Akintola University of Technology over the death of the student, it said the deceased was brought into the Accident and Emergency Unit of the hospital on Thursday, 22 April, 2021, at around 5pm, lifeless.

The statement issued by the Public Relations Officer of the hospital, Omotayo Ogunleye, stated that the late student was brought already dead as documented by the attending physician.

"According to reports gathered, Mr. Afeson was said to have climbed a fence/electric pole fiddling with a life wire. In the process, he was said to have suddenly fallen down into a septic tank.

"It took the efforts of some of his colleagues to bring him out of the septic tank after about 20 minutes. He was brought into the hospital drenched, possibly from the water poured on him by his colleagues to wash off faecal matters on his body. Moreover, additional time must have been spent between the rescue time and his appearance at the teaching hospistatement the LAUTECH Teaching Hospital said.

The management of the hospital added that at the Accident and Emergency Unit, Cardio Pulmonary Resuscita-

tion (CPR) was initiated by the A&E nurses and the attention of the doctor was immediately drawn to the situation, after which the doctor examined and declared to the Dean of Student Affairs on arrival that the patient had passed on.

However, the students returned and destroyed the properties of the hospital and chased the hospital workers with the intention of harming them.
