three other suspects. Although The Guardian reporter was not able to see the affected woman, an eyewitness, Bayo Oladeji, said the woman was walking by the side of the road when they suddenly heard her screaming.

He said: "A woman was walking by the side of the road when suddenly we heard her screaming. We discovered someone was pulling her leg inside the hole, so we ran after the man. When we got to the tunnel, the man ran inside quickly and we decided to set all the entrance to the
