

Delta: Police probes death of man in alleged romp

DELTA State Police Command has begun investigation into the circumstances surrounding the death of a man in a hotel in Delta State.

The man, identified as Mr. Okpako, reportedly died during a romp with his wife's sales girl, in Odibo Ex-

tension in Igbudu area of Warri.

Spokesperson for the police, DSP Bright Edafe, who confirmed the incident, said the girl had been arrested to help the police carry out thorough investigation into the incident.

The Guardian gathered that the middle aged man died,

during a 'marathon' sex with a sales girl, who works in a shop owned by his wife at the popular Igbudu Market in Warri.

The deceased, who is the chairman of Mile 2, Igbudu Market allegedly consumed some sex enhancement substances before the romp. It was gathered that the sales girl raised an alarm to the workers of the hotel, who could not revive the deceased.

The Guardian further gathered that the deceased was rushed to a nearby hospital in the area where medical personnel confirmed him dead on arrival.

It was alleged that the deceased had been dating the girl for sometime before the unfortunate incident took place.

It was further gathered that the girlfriend was detained by the hotel management and handed over to police operatives from 'B' Division in Warri.

Gunmen kidnap ex-governor's aide in Bauchi

GUNMEN have abducted Alhaji Uba Boris, a former Special Assistant (SSA) to former governor of Bauchi State, Malam Isa Yuguda.

It was gathered that Uba, who was SSA on Youth and Director of the State Vocational Centre during Yuguda's administration, was picked up around CBN Roundabout in the Bauchi metropolis about 8:00p.m.

An eyewitness said the ab-

ductors trailed him to Nasarawa gate, where they stopped him and squeezed him into a waiting bike and rode away.

The residents said there were gunshots till the abductors, who came in two power bikes zoomed off.

However, the State Police Public Relations Officer, DSP Ahmed Wakil, could not confirm the abduction as he did not pick up calls put across to him and did not respond to messages sent to his mobile telephone.
