

Plateau police invade cultists' hideout, kill one cultist

The Plateau State Police Command has invaded cultists' hideout in a bid to rid Jos, the state capital of cultism and other forms of criminality and killed one of the cultists in an encounter.

A source told newsmen that the Police came into confrontation with the cultists parading the streets of Apata and Anguwan Suya in Jos North Local Council of the state at about 8:00p.m. The source said that two of the cultists escaped.

Contacted yesterday, spokesperson for the Command, Alfred Alabo, said he was yet to be briefed by the relevant police authorities where the incident took place, adding that he
