ISWAP Kills 200 Boko Haram Terrorists, Families In Borno

THE Islamic State West Africa Province (ISWAP) terror group has killed over 200 Boko Haram terrorists and their families in deadly rivalry clash in the northeast of Gudumbali, Borno State.

clashes, also led to the killings of many Boko Haram women and children.

Acounter-insurgency expert, in the Lake Chad Region, Zagazola Makama, disclosed this, yesterday in Maiduguri.

He said the terrorists and their families were killed, while fleeing ISWAP attacks in the Gudumbali-Kukawa axis of the state, adding that ISWAP targeted Boko Haram enclaves in Gaizuwa community, comprising Mantari, Gabchari, Kashimiri and Maimusari villages in Bama Local Council.

A military source, in Maiduguri, also disclosed that the sustained attacks had led to the dislodgement of hundreds of Boko Haram fighters.

The source said the terrorists scampered to safety and fled towards the Mandara Mountains in the Gwoza Local Council to seek for refuge in the caves of mountains.
