OZENS of persons have been killed following a terrorist attack on a Maulud procession by Muslim faithful at Kusa Village in Musawa Local Council of Katsina State.

The incident, which occurred at 11:00 p.m. on Sunday night, left more than 30 people injured, while 21 others were reported to have been abducted, including women and children.

There are discrepancies in the actual number of those killed. Residents said the figure was as much as 30 persons, while others said the number was higher.
