Police Rescue 12 Children, Arrest Three Suspected Traffickers In Abuja

THEoperatives of the Federal Capital Territory (FCT) Police Command attached to the Rapid Response Squad 74 (RRS 74), at the weekend rescued 12 children from suspected child trafficking ring.

The squad intercepted one Muhammad Isah of Kafanchan, Kaduna, ina Toyota Hiace bus conveying 12 underaged children to a destination later discovered to be in Ogun State.

According to FCT Police spokesperson, SP JosphineAdeh, "Preliminary investigation revealed that the children whose ages are between five years and 16 years, from Akwanga Local Council of Nasarawa State were being trafficked to Ogun State by one

"While investigation is still ongoing and effort in conduit with Nasarawa State Police Command on how to reunite victims with their respective families, the Commissioner of Police FCT, CP Benneth Igweh, wishestoreiterate that the safety of residents remains his utmost priority.

Similarly, operatives of the Nigeria Police Force

Intelligence Bureau -Intelligence Response Team (IRT), have ended the life of notorious kidnapper 'Musa Wada', who was giving Abuja residents sleepless nights. IRT, acting on intelligence, successfully attacked, neutralised and eliminated many other notorious kidnappers including the kidnapping kingpin identifiedasMusaWada(Sabo) Magaji, in an operation conducted around Mpape, Abuja. The team also destroyed the camps of the dreaded kidnappers who have been thorns in the flesh of Abuja residents in recent times.

Police spokesman, ACP MuyiwaAdejobi, who made the disclosure, noted that armed bandits engaged the police operatives in a gun battlethatlasted for about 30 minutes, which left many of the bandits fatally injured, while one of the police operatives sustained bullet wounds.

"This significant achievement follows closely on the heels of neutralisation Abubakar Wada, an associate of Musa Wada, on February 8, 2024, who served as a lead to their hideout. Musa Wada, aka Sabo, was the mastermind behind numerous kidnappings for ransom activities plaguing areas including Mpape and Bwari in the FCT; Kagarko in Kaduna; Masaka, and Nukun Village Nasarawa State.
