Airstrikes by the Air component of Operation Hadarin Daji (OPHD) of the Nigerian Air Force (NAF) on Bello Turji's camp between Zamfara and Sokoto states has killed scores of fighters including three kingpins.

Bandits have killed a driver, simply identified as Danladi Jobe, and abducted two others along the Abuja-Kaduna highway.

A resident of Jere, Yahuza Alhassan, told our correspondent on the phone, yesterday, that the incident took place around 9.33 p.m. at Dogon-Fili, a few kilometres away from Jere town.

He said the deceased was returning from a neighbouring village market when the bandits suddenly emerged from the bush and opened fire on the car, killing the driver instantly.

"The bandits after killing the driver, now went after the man, who is a farmer and dispossessed him of N980,000 cash, before they now whisked him away alongside one other person from the car into the bush," he said.

Spokesman of Kaduna police command, DSP Mansur Hassan, neither responded to calls nor replied to messages sent to him on the incident at the time of filing this report.
