Tragedy as 16 passengers die in Enugu auto crash

BOUT 16 passengers were beyond recognition while two others were rescued alive following an auto crash that occurred along Opi-Nsukka road, in-Enugu State on Tuesday evening.

The two victims rescued alive were rushed to a hospital where they are being treated for injuries.

Confirming the incident, spokesperson for Enugu Command, **Police** State Daniel Ndukwe, urged members of the public to help in identifying the victims.

Ndukwe in a statement vesterday, explained that the Commissioner of Police, Kanayo Uzuegbu has visited the scene of the incident. describing it as a "sad one". He said: "Enugu State Police Command wishes to inform the public that a lone fatal auto crash occurred on April 30, at about 5:20 p.m., at Ekwegbe, along Enugu/Opi/Nsukka Road. claiming the lives of yet-to-be identified 14 males and two temales who were burnt beyond recognition.

"The incident involved an 18seater white-coloured Toyota Hummer bus with a Bauchi State registration number DAS 215 XA and the inscription vegetables, other food items, "Masha Allah".

along the road. "A preliminary investigation reveals that the vehicle unfortunately burst into flames burning beyond the recognition, individuals, who were taken and the hospital confirmed dead.
