## Police arrest suspects over murder of 21-year-old student in llorin

THE police in Kwara State have arrested some suspects in connection with the murder of a 21-year-old female student of the College of Health Technology in Offa.

The deceased Awesu Mojisola of the Ghomi area of Offa in Kwara State, was declared missing on August 9, and her remains were discovered at a dump site near Aleniboro in the llorin area of the state

Police sources said Mojisola's 21-year-old Blessing. roommate. reported her missing at the police station.

At the station, Blessing disclosed that her late friend

and roommate received a phone call on August 9 from one Miss Timileyin, who informed her about an event

organised by the students of Summit University and Al-Hikmah University in Ilorin. According to her, Timilevin

Adebayo Happiness, a male Summit University student party for N15,000.

arriving in Ilorin, Mojisola immediately called to inform Blessing that the party arrangement was a ruse, as about there was no indication of such, and that she was merely lodged at an undisclosed hotel.

uncomfortable in the hotel she was lodged in by Adebayo there was no party at the said communication, her phone was switched off, and all approached

introduced Mojisola to reach her were unsuccessful." Blessing added.

Confirming the incident, the who invited her to the night spokesperson for the Kwara State Police Command, The Guardian learnt that on Adetoun Ejire-Adeyemi, said in a statement yesterday: "The Kwara State Police Command wishes to inform the public an ongoing investigation into a case of culpable homicide reported on August 12, at about 730 a.m. by one Mr Olorunoje of "She told me that she was the Aleniboro area in Ilorin, Kwara State.

"According to Mr Olorunoje, Happiness and noted that on August 11, at about 8:00 p.m., he was returning home location. Shortly after this from the mosque when a group of labourers and him subsequent efforts I made to informed him of a disturbing

discovery. They had found the body of an unidentified female of about 25 years old in a dump site near the Aleniboro area Ilorin."

Ejire-Adeyemi said following the report, detectives were dispatched to the scene. "Upon arrival, the scene was

carefully examined and photographed. During the initial investigation, traces of blood were found near the left ear of the deceased.

"The body was subsequently taken to the General Hospital in Ilorin, where a medical examination confirmed that she was dead. Her remains have since been deposited in the morgue. The deceased was later identified as Miss Awesu Moiisola .
