Tragic death sparks FUOYE students' protest over unsafe Oye-Ikole road

CTUDENTS from the > Federal University Oye-Ekiti (FUOYE) yesterday paralysed operations at the Federal Road Maintenance Agency (FERMA) office in Ado-Ekiti. demanding immediate repairs to the Ove-Ikole Federal Road.

The protest followed the 1 · death of a final-year student, allegedly due to the road's deplorable condition.

Large vehicles such as petroleum tankers and 18-wheel trucks. including those transporting Dangote products for Cement and Mikano. frequently use the road.
