The daughter said while her father and the others were still identifying the bad ones, they heard a gun shot and in the Nsukkalast Tuesday to protest the gruesome killing of Ezeronwu. apprehension, Ezereonwu used Ezeronwu's neighbours on his cell phone to call the police.

According to her, no sooner had the police team arrived than one of them pulled his gun at his father and shot him. He died on the spot. Another member of the

vigilance group, who was shot in the leg, by the police team is said to be receiving medical treatment at the Obavi Memorial Hospital at Nsukka, with the police

Obavi Avenue, Nsukka, also stormed the office of the Divisional Police Officer (DPO), Mr. J. O. Ohanbanu, shortly after the three professors at the UNN stepped out to vehemently kick against the killing of Ezeronwu, whom they said was "the life wire of the

vigilance group". Akubue told the Sunday Independent: "The suspect who was shot in the leg by the police and is now receiving treatment in

a hospital has made a statement explaining what happened. And the explanation is a rebuttal of the DPO's claim that Ezeronwu was an armed

robber. "The wounded suspect said in his statement to the police that the late Ezeronwu had no gun. And that there were people who had identified the gun placed on the chest of Ezeronwu as the same gun the police had placed

on several other persons they

killed in the past." The catholic priest said when they met with the DPO, he had drawn his attention to the large number of Ezeronwu's neighbours massed at the police
