Four Feared Dead

As protest continues to trail the declaration of Osun State Governor, Olagunsoye Oyinlola, as win-

ner of last Saturday's election, four persons were feared dead and 60 others arrested by the combined

team of soldiers and policemen. Besides, 20 houses and about 40 vehicles belonging to chieftains of the Peoples Democratic Party

(PDP) were burnt in the protest.
