Gunmen Kill Two Soldiers In Kano

Armed men at the weekend killed two soldiers on special duty at Falgore Forest in Doguwa Council of Kano State and stole their guns.

He added that the gunmen took the soldiers a few metres away from the scene of the inci-

"I heard several gunshots some metres away from where we were lying. Some minutes later, when they had gone, we stood up only to see the soldiers where and ordered the driver to lying in their own pool of blood," he stated.
