

# Fayose's House Collapses In Ibadan, Kills Six

At least six people lost their lives when a two-storey building allegedly belonging to former governor of Ekiti State, Ayo Fayose, collapsed in Ibadan on Monday.

The victims were working in the building, which was still under construction at Ojoo area of Ibadan.

The only survivor, simply identified as Wasiu, reportedly left his co-workers to defecate in a nearby bush when the disaster occurred.

He, however, came back to see his colleagues trapped in the collapsed building with hundreds of sympathisers trying to rescue them. A team of policemen led by the Divisional Police Officer, Ojoo Police Station, Aikila Austine, was guarding the collapsed building.

There was no signpost on the construction site to show the name of the owner or the name of the engineer handling the project, but residents said Fayose owns the building because he visits the site regularly.

"Fayose had his spare part shop here. He was one of us when he used to sell spare parts and later started to import Tokuboh cars before he became governor."
