♦ Four Die As Bus **Runs Into Market**

Tragedy struck at the weekend, when a commercial bus lost control and killed four

The incident occurred along Tom Jones Road, Lagos Island, on Sunday.

It was gathered that the commercial Mitsubishi Mazda Bus, marked EQ 322 LND (Lagos), driven by one Kolawole Olakunle, was about to take off when it suddenly lost control.

The vehicle skidded off the road and ran into a crowd of traders, who were displaying their wares by the roadside at the popular Dosumu market, Lagos Island.

However, the Lagos State Police Command Public Relations Officer, Frank Mba, Deputy Superintendent of Police (DSP), confirmed that four persons died on the spot, while others received varying degree of injuries.

He gave the names of the diseased as Mohammed Sanni, Ramotu Mohammed, Shade Olaoluwapo and Sherifat

Mba said the corpses of the victims had been removed by policemen from Ebute-Ero Divisional Police Station, Lagos Island and deposited at an undisclosed public mortuary for autopsies. Similarly, a bus conductor was at the weekend sent to an early grave, when a tipper rammed into his vehicle.

The incident, involving the tipper lorry marked XH 932 MUS (Lagos) and a Coaster bus, with registration number DK 398 AAA (Lagos), occurred on Saturday at Ile-Epo Bus stop, along Bâdagry Expressway.

It was tearnt that the bus conductor, identified as Ugochukwu Nwogwu, died on the spot.

Meanwhile, Mba disclosed that the police had launched a manhunt for the hit-and-run driver of the ill-fated tipper lorry, while the corpse of the victim had been removed and deposited at a public mortuary for post-mortem examination.

It was gathered that the driver of the bus in which. diseased was travelling, had told the policemen that he w


