# Gunmen Kill Catholic Priest, Three Policemen In Delta

Three mobile policemen have been killed by bandits in Isiokolo, Delta State, in an orgy that also took the life of a Catholic Priest, John Mark Ikpiki, and led to the stealing of his Hyundai Elantra car marked EH 447 SMK.

The car was later abandoned in Ohruwhorum.

Police Public Relations Officer, Charles Morka, confirmed the deaths, as well as the recovery of the car, and that investigation is on to apprehend the murderers. Ikpiki was going to settle an accident case involving a vehicle belonging to his

church when he met his untimely death on Tuesday.

An eyewitness said he was dragged out of his car and shot in the head: which suggested assassination.

Sympathisers rushed him to a hospital where he was certified dead by doctors.

He was until his death the Director of Communications of the Warri Diocese of the Catholic Church, and he featured regularly on television in the city to propagate the Gospel.

"Immediate reaction is one of deep shock, profound sadness, grief;" said Richard Burke, the Archbishop and Administrative Head of the Warri Diocese.

"My heart goes out to the family members of (Ikpiki) and also to all my Catholic brothers and Priests. My heart also goes out to the members of St. Ambrose Parish and his colleagues and associates in Verias Communications, which is the communication organ of the Archdiocese.

"That is my immediate reaction; but coupled with that, I know outrage is a strong word, but this is something close to that. Such a senseless and tragic incident happened to a completely innocent man of the Gospel who was sent to do his legitimate assignment in that area and was in the process of discharging the assignment. In the twinkle of an eye, in the space of a few seconds, his life was taken away.

"Of course, it brings into play the growing issue in our community of insecurity. I know the police are doing their best - as anywhere you go there are police check points on major highways. They have a part to play, and they are doing the best they can, but it is ironic that this particular incident could happen right under the nose of the police, very close to a police station and almost, as I understand it, under the nose of the Armed Forces.

"So, there is the need to look at the whole issue of security in the society. It is not just a police issue or Army issue, it is more than that, and deeper than that. It brings about the question of the kidnapping of our children. We are all responsible for the situation, we cannot just point fingers at any section of our society.

Burke blamed the upsurge in crime on poor social background. "It has to do with upbringing and education, and that is why we have been pleading for years for the government to give us back our schools so that we can train our children in the way they are meant to be trained.

"To give them a good moral education, a good religious education with values of the Gospel, human decency so that they can grow up to be law-abiding citizens.'
