Two Feared Killed In Auto Crash

Two passengers of a commercial vehicle were sent to their early graves at the weekend, when it lost control while in motion.

The incident occurred on Saturday at Ewadogbon Bus Stop, along Igando Road, a suburb of Lagos.

Daily Independent gathered that the Mitsubishi Bus, marked XB 193 ASB and driven by Waheed Usman, lost control before it somersaulted three times.

Two passengers, Mrs. Taiwo Adefuye (52), and Ogunsola Musibau (20), lost their lives in the crash.

Two other passengers sustained varying degrees of injury.

However, the Lago's State Police Command Spokesman, Frank

Mba, confirmed the accident.
According to the
Superintendent of Police (SP), the
two surviving victims were on
admission at an undisclosed
hospital in the city, where they are

responding to treatment.

He added that the corpses of the two passengers had been removed by traffic policemen from Igando Divisional Station and deposited at an undisclosed public mortuary for post-mortem examination.

Meanwhile, two members of a robbery gang met their waterloo during an encounter with a team of anti-robbery policemen in Lagos at the weekend.

Following a distress call, it was learnt that anti-robbery operatives from Amukoko Divisional Police Station exchanged gun fire with the bandit, who operated on two motorcycles.
