Auto Dealer Robber y Suspect Killed By Police In Ile Ife

An Ibadan-based motor dealer, identified as Ademola Taofeek and believed to be the leader of a robbery syndicate that has been terrorising the banking sector in Oyo State in recent times, was among those gunned down during an Ile-Ife bank operation on Monday by the police.

Osun State Police Public Relations Officer (PPRO), Joshua Olayemi, disclosed this on Tuesday in Osogbo while parading three bank robbery suspects.

They were arrested on Monday during Ile-Ife robbery operation.

Ten persons reportedly died while 40 others sustained bullet wounds during the operation.

The syndicate, according to the police spokesman, was the same gang that robbed banks in recent times in Ibadan and other parts of Oyo State.

Large number of AK 47 rifles, two vehicles, including a jeep and an 18-seater commercial bus, 13 magazine guns, four sharp cutlasses, 129 ATM cards, 13 expended AK 47 ammunitions, one sharper iron rod and a cash of N173,110 were recovered from the robbers.

Substances suspected to be cocaine were also recovered from the 20-member gang that struck at Ile-Ife.

One of the arrested robbers, Julius Adewuyi, confirmed to newsmen that the syndicate was the one behind the Ibadan robbery carried out about two weeks ago.

He added that after the Ibadan operation, the gang had successfully carried out three other operations in succession.

The other suspect, Babalola Babatunde, who claimed to be an Economics teacher with the Osun State Government, denied having knowledge of the claim of Julius Adewuyi.

Babatunde claimed that he is a serving teacher with Ayudun Grammar School, Labata, in Ife-South Local Government area of the state.

He denied that he was a member of the gang that robbed the bank.

He said he was arrested by the police at Ile-Ife during a visit to the town.

But Adewuyi insisted that Babatunde was one of the leaders of the gang that usually come to him for operation adding that he (Adewuyi) was engaged as a driver to the gang.
