### **Robbers Kill Bayelsa Utd Captain**

Tragedy struck the Nigeria Premier League (NPL) champion, Bayelsa United, less than 24 hours after winning the Nigerian title for the first time in its 10-year history.

Skipper of the new champion, Abiel Tabor, was shot dead by daredevil armed robbers late Sunday, along Oghara - Warri Highway, while travelling to visit members of his family in Warri

Tabor, who featured as a substitute in the 2-2 draw against Warri Wolves at the Oleh Township Stadium, travelled with the team from Oleh to Oghara in a convoy.

On arrival at the team's Enor Splendour Hotel camp in Oghara, Tabor was said to have embarked on the fateful journey home in company of his two brothers and a friend, in his personal Honda car at about 11.00 p.m.

One of the brothers, who was still in shock, narrated to our correspondent that it was while approaching one of the numerous check points on the highway that it became apparent to them that armed robbers were operating.

According to him, it was in a bid to escape the men of the underworld that Tabor decided to make a u-turn.

But Tabor's move attracted the attention of the robbers, who gave a chase to his Honda car before opening fire at it, which eventually led to some of bullets hitting the Bayelsa United skipper in the head.

The incident resulted in the somersault of the car.

When the spinning stopped, the car remained upside down, and Tabor's brothers and their friend climbed safety out of it. The survivors attempted to pull Tabor out of the wreckage of the car, but apparently miffed by the fact that the driver (Tabor) tried to evade them, the robbers flatly refused to allow Tabor to be extricated for the required first aid.

All attempts to plead with them fell on deaf hears.

"It was something that we did not expect to happen at that time though it was a little bit late I the day. My brother died because the robbers refused to allow us help him. They threatened that if we continued to beg them, they would shoot us and we had to keep quiet because we didn't want another person to be shot," Tabor's junior brother.

Overcame with emotion, the brother could not hold back his tears as he tried to recount the unfortunate incident that played out just six hours after Bayelsa United was crowned
