Suspected Hoodlums Kill Ex-AIT Reporter On Valentine Day

SUNDAY, Valentine Day, has turned awry for Efenji Efenji, a former African Independent Television (AIT) reporter who was reportedly hacked to death by suspected assassins.

The tragedy occurred at a popular relaxation spot (name withheld) in Karu, in the outskirts of the Federal

Capital Territory (FCT). A group of about 15 machete and axe wielding vouths allegedly attacked and inflicted several wounds on the head, body of Efenji and left him to bleed to death.

According to a relative of the late Efenji who simply identified himself as Innocent, the deceased alongside his wife and their nine-month old baby boy together with himself (witness) and his own wife and baby had gone out in the spirit of the day to relax and share moments together.

Innocent disclosed that at a time in the garden, the whole place became rowdy with bottles being broken by some youths and they had to relocate to somewhere else in the area.

No sooner had they relocated to somewhere else in the garden when they could

not tell where Efenji was, especially given the rowdy nature of the place. As he was looking for the deceased, he chanced on him

being hit with cudgels and cutlasses by over 15 suspected hoodlums. Innocent said he attacked the armed youths but was floored while the late Efenii

was calling on him not to allow them kill him. A visibly pained and angry Innocent said it was when he was down that the police arrived and arrested him despite his protestations that he was a relative of somebody that was attacked and that the police should accompany him to look for the whereabouts' of the mortally wounded Efenji.

Despite his appeals, Innocent expressed bitterness that the police did not give heed as he was bundled off together with the manager of the garden where the incident occurred to the Karu Divisional Police Station.

The time was 11.00 p.m.

Area Commander of Abuia Metro at the Karu Police Station, Sunday Odukoya, said the police would brief the press when they have made inroads into the matter.

He disclosed that the manager of the garden and two suspects have been taken intocustody.
