## Four Held Over Death Of Korean

POLICE in Enugu State have arrested four gunmen, suspected to be killers of a Korean, Yon Sho Lee. Sunday Independent sources disclosed that Lee was in company with three other Koreans and a Nigerian when he was killed by the gunmen who operated on motorcycle.

The victim was killed at the premises of Runchen Mo-

tors, at 35 Presidential Road, Enugu, where he had gone to buy a Mercedes Benz Jeep 500 L Model, which he had earlier discussed the price with the auto-dealer.

It was learnt that the car dealer, Raphael Nwankwo.

presented the documents of the car to Lee for verification and while he was doing so, two young men rode into the car dealer's premises on a motorcycle.

They were said to have ordered the Korean to hand over

the money to them. Before he obeyed, the two young men pulled out shotguns and fired at him at a very close range.

As Lee shouted in pains and slumped, they grabbed his bag from him and escaped from the scape.

With the sound of the gunshot, everybody at the vicinity fled for his dear life, leaving Lee, who lay on the floor in a poll of his own blood. The Korean national was said to have died instantly. Eye witnesses said that policemen arrived at

the scene few minutes after.

Enugu State Police Public Relations Officer (PPRO), Ebere Amaraizu, confirmed the incident, saying that police investigations revealed that the gunmen took away \$14,500 belonging to the victim.

Amaraizu also confirmed that four suspects had been arrested including the car dealer and his staff, saying that the police was working on the theory that there must have been an insider collaboration in the crime.
