

Police kill ex- Ondo High Court registrar's son

TRIGGER-HAPPY policeman attached to the Special Anti-Robbery Squad (SARS) of Ondo State Police command on Sunday, shot dead a Part Three Political Science student of Adekunle Ajasin University (AAU).

The deceased, Damilola Agbede, was said to be returning from a night club in Ijapo Estate, Akure, the state capital at about 2.a.m. when the incident occurred.

The latest victim of police extra-judicial killing, Agbede, was the son of the immediate past Chief Registrar of the State High Court, Elder Olusola Agbede.

He was reportedly gunned down while driving in his white Toyota Camry 2006 model, by a yet-to-be identified policeman in the SARS team.

The policeman reportedly opened fire on Agbede's car when the deceased allegedly refused to stop at the gate house leading to the estate where the team mounted a check point in the early hour of Sunday.

The gun shots came from the rear of the car, scattering the rear screen before hitting the deceased on the back of his head, leaving blood stains all over the driver's seat.

Although, the police authority has confirmed the killing of Agbede, but they alleged that he was the leader of a six-man robbery syndicate specialising in snatching cars, and had been on the wanted list of the command before the Sunday incident.
