Ilupeju, a subsidiary community of lian Ekiti to the state capital, where she was said to have suddenly ran into the robbery gang. The source said the robbers were already dispossessing some victims of their personal effects and as the motorcyclist was try-

ing to make a u-turn and return to lian Ekiti, one of the robbers shot at the woman at the back and she died immediately.
