Three killed in Kwara as robbers attack bank

THREE people were on Thursday reportedly killed in Offa, Kwara State, by suspected armed robbers who attacked two branches of a first generation bank in the town.

The suspected robbers, who were said to be more than five in number, also reportedly <u>carted away</u> an amount of money yet

to be ascertained.
Some of those who died
were said to be customers
who were on the bank's
premises by the time the
robbers struck.

A student of a higher institution in the town whose name could not be ascertained as at press time was said to be among

the casualties.

It was learnt that bullets of the armed robbers who shot sporadically hit him where he was with-

drawing money from the ATM machine of one of the affected banks.

The armed robbers were said to have operated for about 40 minutes between 11.00 a.m. and 12.00 noon and caught their victims unawares at the two branches of the bank they attacked.

The robbers, according to eyewitness account, divided themselves into two groups with one shooting sporadically

into the air to scare away the unsuspecting customers at the frontage of the banks while the other went inside the banking

hall.
They were said to have operated in the banks without being assailed by security agents before they escaped out of the

town through Ira road.

As they were escaping through the route the suspected robbers reportedly shot sporadically

into the air to scare away residents who scampered to safety to avoid being

hit by bullets.

It was learnt that police in the town mobilised and ran after the robbers on the route but could not

catch up with them.
Acting Kwara State Police Public Relations Officer (PPRO), Stanley Onyekwele, confirmed the attack and said investigation had begun into the incident.
