Armed men kill two AUN students in Yola

Two STUDENTS of the American University of Nigeria (AUN), Yola, Adamawa State were on Sunday killed by armed men believed to be robbers.
This was disclosed by the President of the University, Dr. Margee Ensign, who gave the names of the stu-

dents as Mr. Levi Nyat Yusuf and Mr. Abaagu Charles.
The students were attacked and killed on the night of September 4 at a suya spot near the Jimeta main market in Yola, capital of Adamawa State.
