

ll four in Potiskum Gaidam bans use of motorcycles

SOME unknown gunmen attacked Wednesday passengers in a bus at Potiskum, one of the cosmopolitan towns in Yobe State, killing four, including a woman, after the driver of the bus stopped to refuel at Texaco junction, Potiskum.

The bus, according to eyewitness, was conveying some Igbo traders from. Maiduguri to South East when the gunmen attacked the travellers.

Confirming the killings, ne Yobe State Police the Commissioner, Tanko Lawan, said the gunmen came on two motorcycles, covering their faces with black cloths before firing gunshots through the

windows of the vehicle.

He said no arrests were made in the afternoon attacks and killings.

The four bodies, he added, were carried and deposited by the Joint Task Force (JTF)) at General Hospital, Potiskum for identifications.

It was gathered that the passengers in the bus were mainly traders from Maiduguri and Yola,

Adamawa State and were the state from 6:00pm traveling to the Eastern part

of the country. In view of the prevailing insecurity and determination of the security agencies to ensure the protection of lives and properties, Yobe State Governor, Ibrahim Gaidam, has approved with immediate effect the restriction of all public movement through out

to7:00am.

He has also banned operation of commercial motorcyclists in Damaturu, Potiskum, Gashua, Nguru and Geidam, stating further that the law applies in all the local government areas that President Goodluck Jonathan recently declared a state of emergency, calling on the people of the state to comply with the order.
