NO FEWER than 22 persons, including six children, were on Monday killed in an automobile accident at the Step-Down area of the Ore end of the Benin-Shagamu Expressway.

The crash involved a passen-

ger bus and a trailer.

An eyewitness stated that a loud sound with accompanying fire was heard by passers by when an 18-seater Toyota Haice commercial bus with registration number LAGOS XK 501 EKY collided with a trailer with registration number DELTA XN

563 KWL.

According to reports, the driver of the passenger bus belonging to Orient Global Tours Limited was driving against traffic when the accident occurred.
