Robbers raid bank, kill policeman in Lagos

SUSPECTED armed robbers numbering about 10 on Tuesday raided a new generation bank branch at Palmgroove on the Ikorodu Road, Lagos, where they shot and killed one police corporal on guard duty.

An undisclosed amount of money was said to have been carted away by the hoodlums during the raid.

The latest robbery attack would make the second in less

than three months.

A top officer at the Panti Street, Yaba, police office confirmed the alleged stolen amount to *Daily Independent* in a telephone interview.

The officer said preliminary investigation has revealed that the operation had an insider connection.

"We want to start from there.

How did the criminals manage to have knowledge that such amount of money was coming into the bank from a customer?

"Definitely, someone must

have informed them and that person must be either one of the bank's staff or close person to the customer, who is working for the robbers," the source added.

Meanwhile, police headquarters in Abuja has re-deployed Lagos State Police Public Relations Officer, Samuel Jinadu, a Deputy Superintendent of Police (DSP).

Even though no reason was given for the redeployment it was gathered that it might not be unconnected with an inter-

view he allegedly granted a television station on the recent anti-fuel price hike protest in Lagos.

A source closed to the Lagos State Police Command said the PPRO did not obtain permission to appear on the TV talk show "over such a sensitive issue of national importance".

"You know that the fuel subsidy topic is not a matter to be treated with kid-glove, even with its attendant consequences and he went on to grant TV interview without permission."
