"When the door was finally Mallam Musa and his wards had got burnt while trying to make an effort to open the door.

fast asleep was burnt to death. By her right hand side was her little one-year-old Aisha, who also got burnt. We found her lying life-

lessly by her mother."

He added that nothing was left of the family's belongings as everything was burnt.

The deceased little sister, Maryam, who stayed with them, but slept in another room, ran out before the roof caved in. She is the only survivor of the fire.

However, the dead had already been buried according to Islamic rites.
