Three killed in Bauchi robbery

THREE PEOPLE have been killed in an armed robbery attack that occurred in Miya village in Ganjuwa Local Government Area of Bauchi State.

Addressing newsmen in Bauchi on Friday, the state Police Commissioner, Mohammed Ladan, said two members of the armed robbers were killed by the villagers while one Ibrahim Mato was shot dead by the hoodlums.

He disclosed that the police had arrested one suspect in connection with attack adding that the command also recovered one AK47, 81 life ammunition of Ak47 rifle, one magazine of AK 47 rifle, four expended AK 47 rifle ammunition, two handsets and a motorcycle with Reg No OC 847 BNJ used by the hudlums during the attack.

He stated that the armed robbers carted away the sum of N900,000 belonging to one Alhaji Musa Bagu after attacking his shop.

The police boss said “the attack was however foiled by an immediate effort of policemen who pursued the hoodlums to nearby bush.

“ The police succeeded in arresting one Iliya Nando of Warji LGA of Bauchi State, who is believed to be among attackers. The suspect was however arrested with one AK47 rifle No. BH.5912. Before the police could come out from the bush, two other robbers were killed and burnt by the villagers.
