## Seven die in Lagos pipeline explosion

SEVEN pipeline vandals were feared dead in a pipeline explosion at liedodo area of liegun in Isolo Ojo Local Government

Nemesis caught up with the thieves who, according to eye witness, vandlalised the facility in the area when an explosion occurred with a ragging infernó that burnt them to ashes

Although the exact casualty figure could not be ascertained when Daily Independent visited the scene, residents told our correspondent that the vandals numbering about four were unlucky in the huge pipeline fire which raged for over five hours.

NEMA seems to be having problems accessing the route.

According to a witness, the raging fire started around 9 p.m. on Monday when about 10 oil thieves loaded in two canoes arrived the scene and started scooping fuel into hundreds of 50 kilogramme jerry cans.

However, nemesis caught up with them when fire was ignited and consumed the whole environment, including the thieves, their jerry cans and other materials.

Tunde Aroyewun, a resident of the area told Daily Independent that the oil thieves usually come to the area in canoes and after scooping fuel, they trav-elled on the stream to the Fes-

As at the time of filing this report, the fire was still raging and a thick smoke enveloped the area. No fire fighters were
