QUIET Abaixa THE community of Ebonyi State, Tuesday turned into

mourning as the news of drowning of three young girls filtered into the city. The girls between the ages of 18, 19 and 21 were said to have drowned in

stagnant water where they went to fetch water.

The incident happened just eight days after the state government took delivery

reticulation of water from Ofuruekpe water scheme to the state capital, Abakaliki.
The girls, Chinonye

who drowned when they were trying to fetch water, were in the Orieuzor community where they accom-panied their neighbour for

the burial of her relation. They were led by a lad to a canal abandoned by

limestone miners to collect water. The story had it that one

of the ladies slipped into the ditch abandoned by mining operators, which had served as source of water to

the Umuigboke community of Oriuzor. One of the girls tried to

rescue their friend only for her to join her in the painful death, just as the third girl, in attempt to rescue the others also slipped to death.
