TWO IN POLICE NET FOR KILLING HERDSMAN

Two suspects – Abubakar Isah and Mohammed Isah – have been arrested by the **police** in Niger State for **killing** a **herdsman**, Mallam Gombo, and making away with the deceased's 45 cows in Bosso area of Minna metropolis.

Late Gombo, it was gathered, was grazing around Bosso, a suburb of the state capital when he was attacked by the **two** men who attacked and killed him before taking over his cows.

Investigation by our correspondent revealed that the **two** partners in crime, armed with cutlasses and other dangerous weapons had accosted Gombo who was unaware of the mission of the intruders as he was pasturing his cows.

While in the grazing field, the **two** men were said to have charged towards their target and gave him several deep cuts on his neck and head until he slumped and gave up the ghost.

Having certified that their target had died, the **two** men later dragged and dumped his body in a nearby bush to conceal their crime as his body was later found at Angwan Daji, near Muslims burial ground.

It was further learnt that the **two** partners in crime later took late Gombo's cows through Maitiumbi en-route Sarkin Pawa road with the intent of disposing the herds of cows before luck ran out on them.

Abubarkar and Mohammed were said to have been ambushed by the **police** in Maitumbi Division who intercepted them after receiving information that a cattle rearer had just been murdered and his cows taken away by some armed men.

Police Public Relation Officer (PPRO), Mr. Pius Edoboor, confirmed the **killing** of the Fulani **herdsman** and the arrest of the suspects while investigation into the matter was ongoing to ascertain the level of their complicity in the crime.

The **police** however retrieved the stolen 45 cows.

Edoboor who assured that the command would continue to do all that is within its powers to protect the lives and properties of *Nigerlites* however appealed to the general public to continue to avail the **police** with information that will help in dealing with criminals.
