Two killed, 6000 displaced in Fulani, Agatu crisis

ANOTHER attack on the Agatu people of Agatu Local Government Area (LGA) of Benue state on Tuesday by Fulani marauders, has seen two persons killed and another 6000 displaced.

State commissioner for Works and Transport, John Ngbede who disclosed this in a chat with newsmen in his office on Friday said two villages; Ikpele and Okpokolo were attacked by the assailants.

He explained that the assailants had attacked the villages in the morning while the villagers were away on their farms, burning and destroying their homes.

The result, he said, is that the inhabitants of the two villages have fled their villages and have taken refuge in near by towns and villages with friends and relatives, adding that apart from the men, all the women and children have fled the affected areas.

He noted that though the assailants may have come with the intent to destroy, the two persons that were killed met with their death in the hands of the attackers who were leaving the villages through Iwali village after wrecking havoc in the area.

Ngbede lamented that the activities of the assailants in the area in the recent past have forced the schools in the affected areas to close down.

The commissioner who noted that the Fulani made incursions into the area through border towns of Nasarawa and Benue, appealed to the government of the two states to tighten security around their border towns.

Yero who spoke at the closing ceremony of the Fourth International Conference of Forum for Cities in Transition, held on Friday, at Murtala Square, said it is the resolve of the government to restore peace and tackle the issues that trigger violence in the state.

Yero who participated in the group discussions and interactive sessions of 5-Day conference organized by Forum for cities in Transition, FCT in collaboration with Kaduna State government, said there is no substitute to peace except through dialogue and understanding one another.
