Auto crashes kill three persons in Lagos

THE Lagos State Police Command on Monday disclosed that no fewer than three persons were killed in three auto-crashes along major expressways in the state in the last 24 hours.

Speaking through its spokesperson, Ngozi Braide, the command said that on June 8, at about 7am, at Cele bus-stop, along Apapa-Oshodi Expressway, a Daewoo Nubira with registration number KJA 971 hit an unidentified female pedestrian.

The car, driven by one Anaeto Ikechukwu Samson of No.20 Alahum Ozumba Street, Maza-Maza, Lagos was alleged to have lost control and rammed into the lady.

According to Braide, the vic-

tim died on the spot, while her corpse has been deposited by police officers from Itire police station at the Mainland General Hospital mortuary for autopsy.

That same day along Lagos-Abeokuta Expressway a Danfo bus with registration number AAA 860 XH, driven by a yet to be identified driver had a lone accident, which led to the death of a female passenger, who fell from the bus.

Braide, a Deputy Superintendent of Police (DSP) said that the corpse of the passenger has been deposited at same mortuary for autopsy by police officers attached to Gowon Estate Police station.

A male pedestrian was also hit by a truck with registration number APP 326 XB driven by one Badmus Akeem (male) of No.35, Ilogbo Street, Okokomaiko, Lagos.
