Mimiko's ex-media aide, Oshodi, dies at 51

Former Special Assistant on Media to Governor Olusegun Mimiko of Ondo State, Akinwale Oshodi, is dead. He hailed from Akure, the state capital, and was aged 51 years.

The late Oshodi died last Saturday at the State Accident and Trauma Centre, Laje Road, Ondo Town, from injuries he sustained after he was involved in a lone car accident along Ore-Ondo Highway on Friday, on his way back from Lagos.

His car reportedly went up in flame after it veered off the main road into the bush, while he was rescued from the burning car with severe degrees of burnt.

He was rushed to the State Accident and Trauma Centre in Ondo Town where he has been receiving treatment until he breathed his last on Saturday morning.

Oshodi worked as a broadcast journalist and radio personality in the services of Ondo State Government-owned Ondo State Radiovision Corporation (OSRC) in the 90s, but left in a controversial manner in 2007.

During his OSRC days, Oshodi became a household

name and very popular among radio listeners across the state for his prolific and mastery in the presentation of 'Newspapers' Review' on the 96.5 FM radio.
