APGA adopts families of slain party members in Imo

The All Progressives Grand Alliance (APGA) is set to take over the upkeep of the bereaved families of five members who died in a ghastly motor accident on their way back from Abuja last week.

The party will also cater for the medical bills of two other members hospitalised in the Federal Medical Centre (FMC), Owerri, Imo State, and Christiana Hospital, Egbu, in Owerri North Local Government Area of the state.

National Chairman of the party, Chief Victor Umeh, disclosed this to newsmen when he paid a condolence visit to the families and those hospitalised as a result of the crash.

Umeh said: "The party shall not abandon these bereaved families of members of our party who died while working for the party."

The chairman was in the company of frontline governorship aspirant of the party in Imo State, Capt. Emma Ihenacho, and other party members. He described the incident that claimed the lives of the party

stalwarts as a very unfortunate tragedy for the party.

Umeh said: “The struggle for the march to Government House must be accomplished and the only way to pay back the members who lost their lives is to win the contest”.

He recalled that APGA won the governorship election in 2011 in the state but regretted that their victory had been badly managed.

, adding that those who worked with Okorocha had abandoned him out of disappointment, leaving him with his family members.
