

Adamawa: Many Feared Killed In Fresh Boko Haram Attack

Suspected Boko Haram members attacked two communities, Sabon Gari and Kafin Hausa, in Madagali Local Government Area of Adamawa State on Wednesday night, sending residents to flee for dear lives.

The casualty figure is yet to be ascertained at the time of filing this report, but sources from the area said no fewer than five people were killed.

However, Adamawa State government has confirmed that only two persons were killed in the Wednesday night attack.

Ahmed Sajor, the Commissioner of Information and Strategy, told newsmen that the two terrorists were killed during a gun battle with the Nigerian military in an attempt to over-run Sabon Gari.

He disclosed that the government and the military were seriously monitoring the reoccurring attacks in Madagali and

environs.

Barely five days ago, similar attacks were launched in neighbouring Gulak, the administrative headquarters of the local government, where scores, including soldiers, were killed.

Confirming Wednesday's attack, Adamu Kamale, representing Madagali, Michika in the Green Chamber of the National Assembly, said the attack lasted about two hours and that the terrorists killed livestock, looted and burnt many houses.
