

Killer Cop Dismissed, Remanded In Prison

Ayodele Famodimu, a corporal who shot Olabode Ojo, a commercial driver, dead at a checkpoint in Oye-Ekiti Tuesday had been remained in prison custody, that is after he was dismissed.

He had undergone an orderly room trial.

Alberto Adeyemi, Police Public Relations Officer (PPRO) who confirmed Famodimu's dismissal said policemen are not trained to kill civilian but to defend lives and property.

Adeyemi said, "He (Famodimu) has already been dismissed and as I am talking to you now, he is an ex-policeman. The case is now in court and we have handed everything over to

court to decide his fate.

"We did not train him to go and kill law-abiding citizens, we trained him to safeguard lives and property. Any of his ilk that goes against the law will face the music."

Famodimu was arraigned before an Ado-Ekiti Chief Magistrate's Court where he was slammed with the charge of murder.

Police Prosecutor, Inspector Johnson Okunade, brought a remand order to the court. He said there was cause to order the remand of the accused in custody for a reasonable length of time.

Okunade said the accused was suspected to have committed the offence of the murder of a driver, Olabode Ojo, and attempted murder of Azeez Ayodimeji.
